#### Safe Student Drop off and Pick up

Thanks to all the First Avenue families for following staff instructions at the drop off and pick traffic points on California and Diamond Streets. We have been successful in keeping kids safe as they exit and enter the cars. Please be sure to drive to the farthest point forward when dropping off or picking up your students in order to avoid traffic from backing up into the intersections.

#### **Tardies and Detentions**

Students who are tardy <u>three times to school</u> will receive a detention, which is usually served on Wednesdays or Fridays, from 3:15-3:45. Those who are <u>tardy six times</u> will be given a double detention, so they will serve two detentions. If students have nine tardies they will serve a double detention as well as a lunch clean up detail and the process for Saturday school will begin for that student. It is extremely important for all students to be at school by at least 8:10 so that they may walk to their classes before the tardy bell rings at 8:15 and not miss any instructional time, which can affect their grades. Parents, please try to get your students to school on time.



# More than a Note

For a child's development, the music program is so much more than pretty notes from an instrument. Let's take the band, for example, our subgroup with the latest gig at this writing.

The back flags spread a blanket and bring the flag and flag poles to roll them for packing on the bus.

The musicians (about 20 or so) form a human chain to move the hats from the top shelf, around the edge of the room, through the glass doors onto the porch.

Every member carried their instrument to the bus. Each student is responsible to make sure their equipment and uniform make it to the parade.

Parents, meanwhile, are



loading the bellies of the bus. Some are polishing shoes. Others are gathering the contents [water bottles, sewing kits, first aid kits, spare parts, duct tape] for the wagons that follow the marching troubadours. Still more are getting the post parade snacks organized and loaded.

At the parade, uniform jackets go on. Student's warm up with their instrument. Parent's move to and fro adjusting hat straps, pant lengths, tucking hair under hats, squirting water into open mouths, just anything to help keep the show healthy and looking good.

Then the kids are broken into their various teams by instrument type and they get tuned. They practice. They get final instructions. And they are off down the street, rolling their feet as they march, watching the diagonals, and playing the best. They are here to perform.



They are here to show off all the hours of practice and preparation.

The kids and parents together are a team. The kids work together, learn to follow instructions and learn to work with each other. The students see the example of parents work-

- An Assignment Tracking Sheet (Ms. Mimura's 7th Grade History)
- Upcoming Tests (Mrs. Reid's 6th Grade Math class)

Some teachers are still using their websites from last year and the new website provides you a link.

This is a great way to see what's happening in your child's class or to find assignments if you're child misses a class. It's another way to stay connected to the school and the class-rooms.

This past October, our First Avenue seventh graders had a great opportunity to attend Outdoor Science School (OSS). Arrowhead

Ranch's five-day program is filled with enriching outdoor activities. First

Avenue teachers rotate and join groups of students during their lessons. A Naturalist is a trained teacher, who leads students out on the trails and delivers lessons throughout the week. The Cabin Leaders work collaboratively with the Naturalist to help supervise and have fun with our students. Throughout the week, students learned about botany, geology, astronomy, habitats and adaptations, energy and conservation, and ecology.



#### A Lesson after Every Meal



Aside from hiking, another favorite activity everyone enjoyed was *eating*. Mealtime was also a great opportunity for teachers to interact with students and to get to know them as individuals. Af-



ter every meal, the Arrowhead's staff members called for an "O.R.T.



(Organic Recyclable Tidbits) report." By sharing three meals a day with approximately 300 people, it was easy to see how much waste could be produced. In the O.R.T. report, buckets of uneaten foods and liquids were collected. It was a clear and simple lesson: **produce less waste.** If you have a

seventh grader at home, ask your child about the O.R.T. report. I'm sure they will remember the importance of reducing needless consumption and the generation of waste.



OSS was certainly an exciting time for both students and teachers. Students will carry these memories for a lifetime. Thank you **Seventh Grade Parents** for allowing your children to attend. 
